Baby Animals: Heritage Breeds at the Banke


Saturday, April 22 – Sunday, April 30, 2023



Ice Dance International Winter Residency

Ice Dance International (IDI), a professional performing-arts ice-dance company, resides annually at Strawbery Banke from mid-January through February. IDI provides the community and schools with pop-up performances and community programming at Strawbery Banke and across New England.

Upcoming IDI Programming at Labrie Family Skate at Puddle Dock Pond

Community Skating Classes: Taught by Douglas Webster, Artistic Director of IDI and Labrie Family Skate, with support from the IDI company, these adult skating classes are open to all and do not require advance registration. Additionally, IDI provides up to three free pop-up youth classes throughout the season. Check the rink schedule for weekly updates

Seacoast Skating with the Stars: Ice Dance International partners with Strawbery Banke Museum for Seacoast Skating with the Stars on Saturday, February 4, 2022, at 2 PM. This 4th annual event partners local "non-skaters" with the IDI pros in a skate-off like Dancing with the Stars.



"Get Out and Skate" Program: Ice Dance International provides accessible ways for people from diverse backgrounds to view and appreciate the art of dance on ice, as well as to

engage in a healthy recreational activity in fun and innovative ways. IDI's partnerships include Little Harbour School and Future in Sight.

Renaming the Shapley-Drisco House

It's not every day that a house is renamed at Strawbery Banke. In late October, a group of Museum staff, friends, and former Puddle Dockers celebrated the renaming of the Shapley-Drisco House to the Shapley-Drisco-Pridham House in honor and celebration of the Pridham Family and all former residents of Puddle Dock.

Sherm Pridham, a friend of the Museum, lived in the Puddle Dock neighborhood, specifically the Shapley-Drisco-Pridham House,

during the 1940s and 1950s. Together with Strawbery Banke, Sherm remains dedicated to preserving and sharing stories about Puddle Dock, including Urban Renewal and the displacement of many families from the neighborhood. More information will be posted to Strawbery Banke social media accounts on how the interpretation of the Drisco-Pridham side of the Shapley-Drisco-Pridham House continues to be enhanced and personalized to the Pridham family.

IN MEMORIAM

William Dean Howells II, "Dean," a longtime friend and supporter of Strawbery Banke, died on Monday, October 3, 2022, at his home in Kittery Point, Maine, overlooking Pepperell Cove. Dean's interest in Strawbery Banke Museum followed in the footsteps of his parents: His father, William White Howells, was the son of architect John Mead Howells, who with Stephen Decatur IV drafted a plan for a "maritime village" to preserve the colonial homes on the Portsmouth waterfront in 1935. Dean's mother, Muriel Howells, a champion of historic preservation, was described as "the woman who orchestrated the founding of Strawbery Banke" and was "instrumental in creating, administering and funding" the Museum. W. Dean Howells supported numerous major projects at Strawbery Banke, including the Heritage House Program, and served as a member of the Board of Trustees.

David Alan Donath, former Director of Strawbery Banke, died on Friday, November 25, 2022, at his home on Lake Groton, Vermont, after battling a long illness. In addition to directing Strawbery Banke, David had a long, successful career as a museum professional, serving in leadership roles at the Woodstock Foundation, the Jackson Hole Preserve, Inc., the Vermont Civil War Commission, the Vermont Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, and Fort Ticonderoga.

Diana Edwards Murnaghan died on Saturday, November 26, 2022, at her Mount Vernon Place home. She was, in her own words, "a ceramic historian and author of seven books on English ceramics, and 30+ articles on French and English ceramics." Diana was on the Strawbery Banke National Council and on the Board of the American Ceramics Circle. In 1988, she was involved in an exhibit and article called "Generations of Trash," featuring ceramics from the Hart-Shortridge House on Deer Street in Portsmouth. The Success to Trade bowl featured in this article is now on display in the "Port of Portsmouth" exhibit in the Thales Yeaton House.
